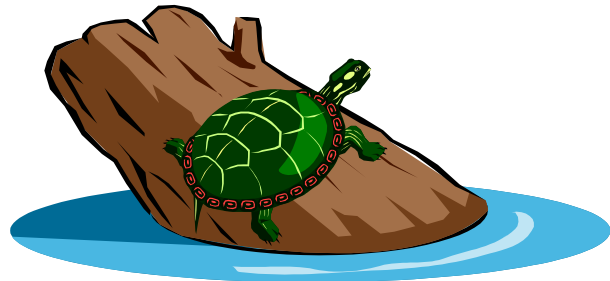

Boats and Floats - With the Fourth of July came the Lynwood Boat Parade, a simple but fun event. More than a dozen “water craft” participated. Shoreline residents cheered them on. (See the pictures at the end.) Hope you had a happy Fourth.

Good Water – Our lake water passed its annual laboratory analysis test with flying colors. The results from EMSL Analytical, Inc. show the lake has less than 1 col/100 ml. Last year it was 56 col/100 ml. Anything below 200 is fine for swimming. The sample was taken at the swim area. Thanks to Jim Levine, Lynco president, for continuing to have the testing done.

Mr. Stukes – Haywood Stukes is usually counseling high school students at Southeast but this summer he’s our security/handyman at the swim area. He’s there to check for membership bracelets, chase geese, maintain the docks, and take care of miscellaneous matters. Swim area problems have all but disappeared since we started using a security person.

Remember - you must wear a Lynco bracelet at the swim area. If you have a guest using that area, you must be present with your bracelet visible.

Deals - Susan Dula took advantage of the deal that Jill Caudill arranged for our neighborhood with the stone quarry. She reports that it is a good thing. Check it out if you need stone for a project. Ask for the Lynwood cash account. Also a local plumber that several Lynwood residents use and like has placed an ad at the end of this newsletter. He can connect you to water and sewer and his wife will handle permits and paperwork.
